


Paul T. Tusch



The requirements for acceptance as a Fellow are rigorous, and include the submission of a lengthy application, obtaining references from attorneys and judges, passing national and state-specific tests, and going through an interview process. To apply for membership, an applicant must have a minimum of ten years experience practicing law and must have concentrated at least seventy-five percent of his or her practice on family law for the last five years.

According to the AAML website, http://aaml.org/, the admission standards include "having substantial trial experience as lead counsel including trial of custody matters, child support, division of property, alimony or spousal support." The applicant is also expected to "be willing to and capable of settling cases in appropriate circumstances."

Paul is a founding member of our firm, and is the chair of its Family Law Practice Group. He has completed all of the mandatory training required by the State of Connecticut to serve as a Guardian ad Litem and as an attorney for minor children in Connecticut courts.
